We would like to invite you to **join us and share your research at the upcoming TEACHING TRANSLATION AND INTERPRETING (TTI 7) conference**, which will take place on **23-24 May 2025**.

The conference will be held at the Faculty of Philology, 171/173 Pomorska Street, Lodz, Poland.

The conference draws on the success of five TTI conferences, held in April 2008 and 2009, October 2011, November 2014, September 2017 and September 2019, where it was unanimously decided that meetings devoted to theoretical and practical aspects of translator training, translation didactics and translation curricula are a necessity.

ABSTRACTS

Participants intending to give a paper should send a 200-300 word DOCX abstract (excluding references) to Michal Kornacki (michal.kornacki@uni.lodz.pl).

The abstract submission should contain:

- the title of the paper
- the name(s) and academic title(s) of the author(s)
- the full name(s) and address(es) of the affiliation(s)/institute(s) of the author(s)
- the theme(s) (see the list of themes) that the paper covers in the top right-hand corner of the document submitted
- a list of references (max. 5). Please use Harvard citation style.

The official language of the conference is English.
